Some of you may see me just once, while I visit others a few times a month. Whether clients need our help with bathing and dressing, or just a friendly visit and loving support, our service is available to area Christian Scientists, still without charge.

Mrs. Eddy instructs us on page 264 of <u>Science</u> and <u>Health with Key to the Scriptures</u>, "Mortals must look beyond fading, finite forms, if they would gain the true sense of things. Where shall the gaze rest but in the unsearchable realm of Mind? We must look where we would walk, and we must act as possessing all power from Him in whom we have our being." Working with clients, we are not going to talk about what the body feels, but how Spirit feels about us. We are not walking with limitations and measured decrees but in strength of Him. Our clients do act with power from Him, and we thank Him for each thing we can do. God is our first aid, and we will support your stand for His unfailing goodness.

Our September workshop, "The Spiritual Dimension of Christian Science Nursing," was for those interested in training as Christian Science nurses and those wanting to explore this precious Manual By-law. It was facilitated by Debbie Stucker, Caroleen Scholet, Griff Henninger, and Mary Roadman. Everyone who attend shared from their hearts and experience.
